#### Ice melting products- by the numbers

- 120,000 MT road salt supplied to GTA, Ottawa region, eastern Ontario municipalities and contractors.
- Over 300,000 km trucking removed from Ontario roadways due to shipping to Picton Terminal vs trucking to Picton

When GTA and Ottawa had salt shortages this winter, PT supplied them with salt; Windsor Salt determines total volumes annually delivered to each port on the Great Lakes and organizes salt distribution from each port.

- 70 MT **FUSION**<sup>TM</sup> Organic Melt ice melter supplied to Amherst Island Wind Farm
- Organic Melt beet juice-based ice melter is easy on the environment and was the logical choice for winter road control, barges and dock safety for Amherst Island workers.
